A Devotional Format of the Pathwork Lectures

In 2012 I completed my six-year project of making audio readings of the 258 Pathwork Lectures. Then in 2013 I noticed that my relationship with the Guide began to change. What I discovered is that I was no longer reading or listening to the lectures for "educational content" or in order to "teach Pathwork concepts to students" or to "have my homework done for an upcoming Pathwork workshop." It was no longer important how many paragraphs, pages, or lectures I read in a day or week. Rather I came to realize that what connected me at a heart-level to the teachings and to the Guide was regular, simple *presence to the material – a daily devotional practice based upon the Pathwork Lectures.*

I realize that the Guide encouraged me in this devotional approach to the lectures. The introduction in a few of the lectures includes the blessing, "Blessed is this hour." I found that my version of this Guide blessing became, "Blessed is this time we (i.e., the Pathwork Guide and I) now spend together in this lecture." Most recently I was spending time with Lecture 88 Religion: True and False and smiled in agreement with the sentences near the end: "May these words raise echoes in your emotions. As you let this lecture affect you, it will stir up so much! This is Good." So yes, it seems that the Pathwork Guide encourages us to slow down and savor the Pathwork Lectures in a devotional practice.

This all helped me understand why a few years ago I found I was formatting the lectures in a way that enriched and facilitated my slower savoring presence to the Guide. Hence, *the Devotional Format of the lectures was born.* Nothing I have done has so energized me and nourished my development in recent years as the time I now spend creating the Devotional Format of the Pathwork Lectures.

The Pathwork Foundation and I now have a suitable contract in place whereby I can make these Devotionally Formatted lectures available to anyone who finds them helpful. There are about 80 lectures in this Devotional Format available thus far.
